






## **Financial** Summary

In 2012, DBSA continued to strengthen our financial position by increasing revenues by more than 17%. DBSA maintained its focus on reducing liabilities by more than 32.5% from 2011. At the same time, DBSA reduced both our accounts payable and our accrued expenses by nearly 47% in 2012.
